- 2) All papers presented at said conventions become the properties of the Society which has priority in considering the same for publication in THE AMERICAN CATHOLIC SOCIOLOGICAL REVIEW unless otherwise provided.
- 3) The Editor of the REVIEW is required to acknowledge immediately receipt of written copies of said papers; and to notify their respective authors of acceptance or rejection, or to make some other mutually acceptable agreement, within three months of submission of written copy. Rights automatically revert to the author if the Editor fails to send such notification.
- 4) Any intention of an author to use material to be included in a paper given at the convention for publication other than in the REVIEW must be approved by the editor of the REVIEW previous to delivery at the convention.

The text develops its emphasis upon the interacting individual first under the concept of "personality" in terms of learning, motivation, life experiences in age groups, and in culture. Then the interacting individual is studied under the broader aspects of the organizations in which he participates.

Small groups, collective behavior, and social structure are then examined under the aspect of the psychological processes which occur within them. The author anchors the scientific material of social psychology to the Christian philosophical concept of man. *His chapter on "Philosophical Forerunners" has been particularly praised by reviewers, both sociologists and psychologists.*
